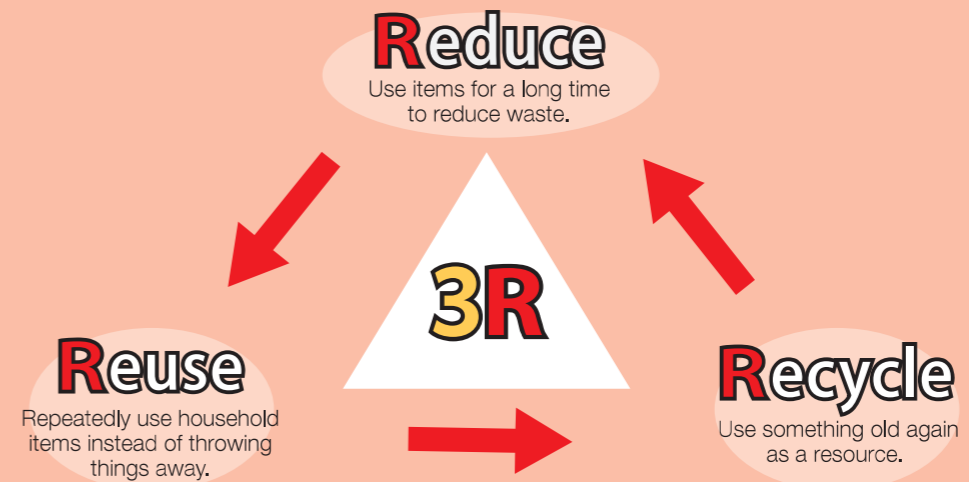

☆ Requests from Kuria ☆

Place waste into a colorless and transparent or translucent garbage bag of 45 L or less before discarding.

The weight of one bag should be up to 10 kg (for the bag to not be torn).

Place refuse at drop-off location by 9 a.m. on collection days for each waste type.

Waste in which the abovementioned rules are not applied or that is not correctly separated will not be collected!



~Changes since April 2020~

- ① Changed part of waste classified as “miscellaneous trash” to “burnable waste.”
- ② Changed the handling of carrying in waste and the fee structure of the service.
- ③ Changed the handling of temporary trash (large volumes of trash) and the fee structure of the service.

① Examples of items whose category was changed from “miscellaneous trash” to “burnable waste”:

- Fashion accessories, albums, toys, cushions, CDs and DVDs (including cases), buckets, and wash bowls
- *For other items, check the definitions and classifications of waste.

② Changes related to carrying in waste

- The payment method when carrying waste into the treatment facilities (Clean Center) was changed to a method that uses collection fee tickets. Attach a bulky waste collection fee ticket or tickets worth 300–1,800 yen to each item before carrying the refuse to the Clean Center.
- The fee for burnable waste was changed to 90 yen per 10 kg.
- For burnable waste, pay for its treatment in cash as before.

③ Changes related to temporary trash (large volumes of trash)

- The category name “temporary trash” was changed to “large volumes of trash.”
- The fee for “large volumes of trash” was changed from the measured rate system (300 yen/10 kg) to 8,000 yen for waste on a vehicle. (*For waste on more than one vehicle, 4,000 yen is charged for each extra truck.)

How to dispose of the waste

- You can discard up to **two** bags of refuse per collection.
- Drain any excess liquid from raw garbage before putting it into the waste.

Common examples

[Raw garbage] 	[Disposable diapers] 	[Analog magnetic tapes] 	[Shoes] 	[Grass and tree limbs/branches]

[Others] Throwaway chopsticks, refrigerants, disposable pocket warmers, aluminum foil, cushions, feminine hygiene products, bamboo blinds *For items not listed in the above examples, feel free to contact the Waste Management Section.				

Precautions!

- Soak cigarettes, cigarette lighters, matches, fireworks, and other flammable objects into water before putting them into the garbage to prevent ignition.
- For tree limbs/branches of 1 m or more in length and 5 cm or more in diameter, discard them as bulky waste.
- When disposing of refuse that you do not want others to see, put the minimum amount of the waste into another bag and then put the bag into a transparent or translucent bag so that the outermost bag is transparent or translucent.
- Bamboo skewers should be wrapped in paper or other materials for safety.
- Solidify small quantities of edible oil or let the oil be absorbed by a paper or cloth.
(*Do not dispose of oil in liquid form.)

How to dispose of the waste

- You can discard up to **two** bags of refuse per collection.
- Dispose of items with a  mark on the containers and labels.


Common examples



Precautions!

- Rinse containers for liquids, such as condiments and detergents, before discarding.
- Remove leftovers and dirt from the plastic waste and empty bottles and tubes before putting them into the trash.
- Break large Styrofoam into pieces before bagging the refuse.
- Containers and packaging indicate holders in which manufacturers and stores put products (containers) or wrap them (packaging).
- Do not put PET plastic bottles into bags for plastic containers and packaging.
- Do not mix plastic products, such as buckets and toys, with containers and packaging waste.


How to dispose of the waste

- You can discard up to **two** bags of refuse per collection.
- Dispose of plastic bottles with a PET plastic bottle mark .
- Empty the bottles, remove the caps and labels, and put only the bottles into a trash bag.

Common examples

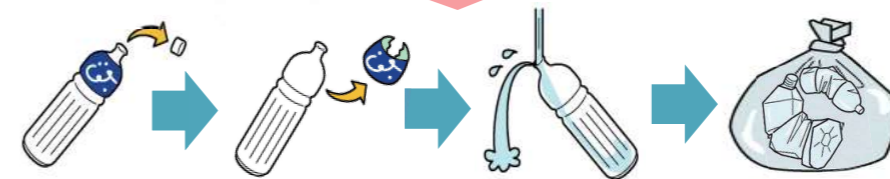
[PET plastic bottles for alcoholic drinks, soy sauce, and beverages]



[Bottles for water dispensers with a  mark]



*For bottles for water dispensers, remove the caps from the bottles and discard the caps as "plastic containers and packaging."



Remove the cap. Remove the label. Give the bottle a quick rinse. Put only the bottle into a trash bag.

***Discard caps and labels as "plastic containers and packaging."**

Precautions!

- Discard caps and labels as "plastic containers and packaging."
- When foreign objects from the bottles and stains are unremovable, discard the PET bottles as burnable waste.
- Bottles with no PET mark will not be collected.



PET plastic bottles

Collected once a week

Empty cans and glass bottles/waste glass


Collected once a week

How to dispose of the waste

- You can discard up to **two** bags of empty cans and up to **two** bags of glass bottles/waste glass per collection.
- Although you can dispose of up to four bags of refuse per collection, you cannot discard four bags containing only empty cans (ditto for glass bottles/waste glass).
- Separate “empty cans” and “glass bottles/waste glass” before discarding.


Common examples

[Steel cans/aluminum cans] [Sweets tins]




Empty the can and give it a quick rinse before discarding.

[Spray cans/portable gas cylinders]



Do not create a hole on spray cans.




Empty the cylinder and remove the cap before discarding.

[Empty bottles]



Empty the bottle and give it a quick rinse before discarding.

[Waste glass]



Put the glass into a bag and label the bag to inform the waste collectors that it is fragile.

Precautions!

- Bags containing both empty cans and glass bottles/waste glass will not be collected.
- Discard *ittokan*, i.e., an 18-liter square can, on collection days for “miscellaneous garbage.”
- Spray cans and portable gas cylinders may cause a fire in a garbage truck and at the incineration facilities. Be sure to completely empty the cans before discarding. If leaving the content of a spray can or gas cylinder is unavoidable, label the can or cylinder to inform the waste collectors. (*Do not create a hole on the cans and cylinders.)



How to dispose of the waste

- You can discard up to **two** bags of used paper and up to **two** bags of used cloth per collection.
- Although you can dispose of up to four bags of refuse per collection, you cannot discard four bags containing only used paper (ditto for used cloth).
- Tie the used paper with string or put the paper into a bag so that the trash does not scatter. (Put the paper together so that the contents can be seen.)
- Separate “used paper” and “used cloth” before discarding.

Common examples

[Newspaper/advertising inserts] [Magazines] [Cardboard]



[Paper bags/paper cartons] (Including shredded paper)



[Others] Paper boxes, sweets packaging boxes, wrapping paper

[Used clothing/towels] [Blankets]



[Others] Bed sheets and other cloth



Discard the following paper as burnable waste because the trash is not recyclable.

- Dirty paper
- Cartons for alcoholic drinks or other beverages of which the reverse side is coated (silver)
- Carbon paper and thermal paper
- Photos and photo paper



Precautions!

- Discard used Kleenexes and photos as burnable waste.
- Discard futon (bedding) and rugs as bulky waste.
- Some neighborhood associations and other entities may collect recyclable paper and cloth as a group. Follow the rules in your residential area.

Used paper/cloth

Collected twice a month

Bulky waste (oversized waste)

Collected twice a month (prior appointment required)

Bulky waste is divided into two subclassifications: “oversized waste” and “miscellaneous trash.”

How to dispose of oversized waste

- Schedule an appointment by calling the Telephone Appointment Center.
- Purchase “bulky waste collection fee tickets.”
- Write your appointment number on the tickets and attach the tickets to each item.
- Place the refuse at drop-off location by 9 a.m. on the collection date.

Oversized waste indicates city-designated waste items with width, depth, and height of 2 m or more and less than 6 m in total. (Each side should be less than 2 m.)

*Refer to pages 9 and 10.

Precautions!

- Call the Telephone Appointment Center to schedule the collection of your oversized waste by two days (except for Saturdays and Sundays) before regular oversized waste collection days (twice a month).
- You will be informed of the fee, collection date, and appointment number.
- If you place waste items that are different from what you have told at the appointment center, no bulky waste collection fee ticket is attached, and the paid fee is insufficient, the refuse will not be collected.
- If you wish to change or cancel the appointment, immediately call the Telephone Appointment Center.
- In cases of plenty of trash, you can schedule an appointment as “large volumes of trash.”
- Items that are not properly separated will not be collected.

If you are disabled and cannot make an appointment by phone, you can schedule the collection by fax.

(Only for the disabled) Fax: 06-6997-7808

- Fax a document that includes your name, address, fax number, waste items to be discarded, the sizes of the waste items, and the number of the waste items.
- We will send a reply by fax to inform you of the collection date, appointment number, and fee.

Bulky waste is divided into two subclassifications: “oversized waste” and “miscellaneous trash.”

How to dispose of miscellaneous trash

- Purchase bulky waste collection fee tickets.
 - Write your name on the tickets and attach the tickets to each trash bag and item.
 - Place the refuse at drop-off location by 9 a.m. on collection days.
- *You do not need to make an appointment by phone at the Telephone Appointment Center.

Miscellaneous trash indicates refuse other than burnable garbage, oversized waste, and recyclables (plastic containers and packaging, PET plastic bottles, glass bottles/waste glass, empty cans, and used paper/cloth) with width, depth, and height of less than 2 m in total.



The collection fee of trash other than oversized waste that can be put into a 45-L bag is 300 yen per bag.
*The weight of one bag should be up to 10 kg (for the bag to not be torn).

The collection fee of waste items that cannot be put into a 45-L bag and with width, depth, and height of less than 2 m in total is 300 yen per item.
*Except for items designated by the city as oversized waste.

Wood/branches or other waste items that are less than 1 m long and cannot be put into a 45-L bag must be tied with strap so that the weight of a bunch is less than 10 kg. The collection fee is 300 yen per bunch.
*Only waste items of less than 1 m in length and less than 10 cm in diameter

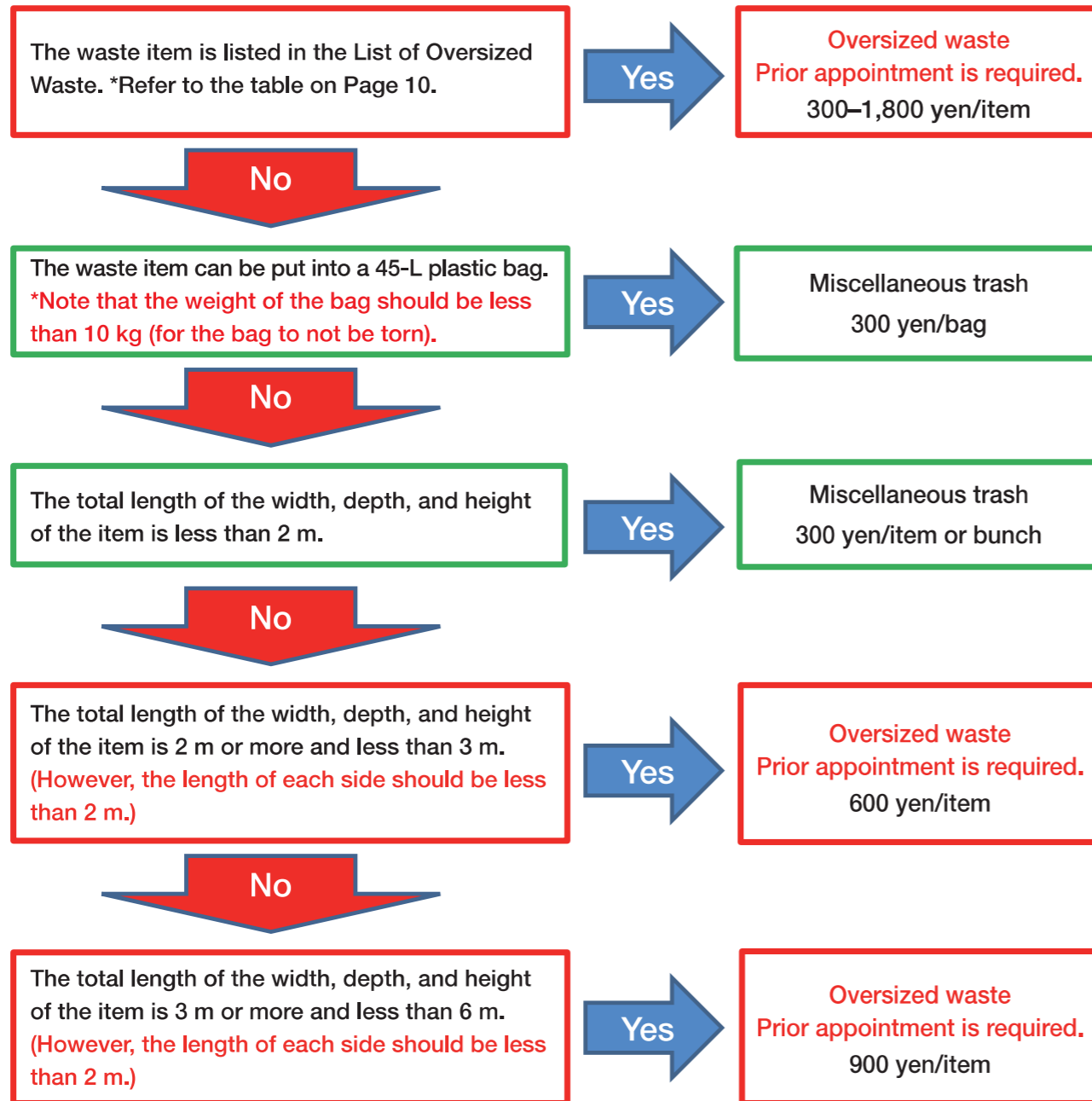

Air conditioners, TVs, refrigerators/freezers, and washing machines/clothes dryers cannot be treated as oversized waste because these items are covered by the Home Appliances Recycling Law. For details on handling these items, refer to Page 17.

Carrying in waste (prior appointment required)

Carrying in waste

Rules for carrying waste in the treatment facilities

<Appointment required>

- Call the **Telephone Appointment Center** to schedule an **appointment** by the preceding day before you carry in waste (except for Saturdays and Sundays).
Hours: 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (including national holidays)
*Prior appointment is required regardless of the means of transportation that will be used (car, bicycle, motor bike, or walking).
- You can carry in waste from 9:00 am to 11:30 am and from 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm on Mondays to Fridays (including national holidays). The appointment interval is 30 minutes.

<Treatment fee>

[Burnable waste] Measured rate system: Pay in cash (90 yen/10 kg).

[Bulky waste] Pay by bulky waste collection fee ticket (300-1,800 yen).

*Attach bulky waste collection fee tickets to the waste items in advance.

*For the detailed fee, refer to pages (9) and (10).

*For large volumes of trash, use the large volumes of trash collection service.

*For recyclables, we only accept recyclable waste generated from ordinary households.

Precautions!

- You have to unload your waste from the vehicle by yourself. If the waste includes heavy objects or the amount of the waste is large, please come with other people.
- The staff will check your waste when it is carried in. You will be required to take back non-acceptable items or all waste items, depending on the circumstances, if the waste includes the following items:
 - Waste carried in at the **request of a person** other than the applicant
 - **Waste that is not separated**
Separate your waste as follows: burnable waste, bulky waste, and recyclables (glass bottles/waste glass, used paper/cloth, empty cans, plastic containers and packaging, and PET plastic bottles).
 - **Industrial waste** and waste that **cannot be treated by the city municipal facilities**
 - Other items inappropriate for carrying in
- If carrying in spray cans and portable gas cylinders, be sure to inform the staff that your waste include these items.
- Please follow the instructions of the staff for safety when carrying in the waste.
- No photos and videos are allowed in the premises without the permission of the facility manager.
- We may record audio or video for improving our services.
- Available hours during New Year holidays are announced in the December issue of the Newsletter Moriguchi in the year.

*The treatment fee is the same as the one for regular collections. Use regular collection services if possible.

On April 1, 2020, the payment method for carrying in the waste was changed to a method that uses collection fee tickets!

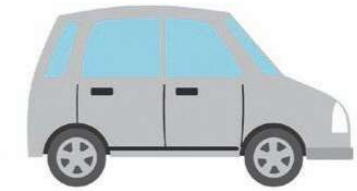


How to carry waste in the treatment facilities

① Schedule an appointment by calling the Telephone Appointment Center.

<Required information when making an appointment>

- Place where the waste is generated (address)
- Waste type (household or commercial)
- Details and amount of the waste
- Means of transportation when carrying in waste
- A confirmation that no industrial waste and items that are difficult to treat are included



② An appointment number will be issued.

You will be informed of an appointment number on the phone. Please keep a record of the appointment number.

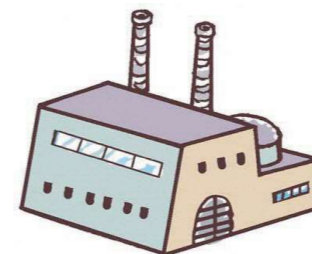

③ The day you carry in the waste

Tell your appointment number and show your identity document, such as your driver's license, at the reception.

④ After going to the reception

The staff will lead the way to the unloading space. Unload the waste items by yourself. Pay the fee in cash depending on the weight of your burnable waste.

Use this collection service when you need to dispose of the large quantity of waste at a time, such as a moving and clean-up (appointment required).

How to schedule an appointment and dispose of the waste

- Schedule an **appointment** by calling the **Telephone Appointment Center** after you check the waste items and their amount.
- Place the waste at the point of collections of burnable waste. If the place of the collection is not in front of your house, be sure to obtain the consent of the neighbors.
- Separate your waste into each type without fail.
- You are required to witness the collection; otherwise, the waste will not be collected.

【Collection fee】

The collection fee is **8,000 yen/truck**. (For waste on more than one truck, 4,000 yen is charged for each extra truck.) The waste collector will give you a statement of payment. Pay the fee at a financial institution later.

Precautions!

- Items that cannot be collected by the city are not acceptable.
- Since there are limits on the number of collections, please make an appointment for the collection of your waste as early as possible.
- We collect large volumes of trash only in the afternoon. Although you can request a date for the collection, the actual collection date may be slightly different from your desired date.
- The staff will call you before coming to the collection site; please prepare so that the staff can contact you on the collection date.
- The waste collectors will not enter your house or premises to take out your waste items. Be sure to place your waste at the point of collection by the collection time.
- Note that the waste collectors may check the waste generation site in advance to estimate the amount of the waste.
- If you wish to change or cancel the appointment, call the Telephone Appointment Center by the morning on the previous day of the collection date.
- Items that are not properly separated will not be collected.

On April 1, 2020, the name “temporary trash” was changed to “large volumes of trash.”



- Purchase a bulky waste collection fee ticket or tickets worth collection fees for bulky waste (oversized waste and miscellaneous trash) and attach the ticket(s) to each bag and waste item.
 - *Write your appointment number or name on each bulky waste collection fee ticket and attach the tickets on each bag and waste item so that the waste collectors can easily find them.
 - ***We do not refund and reissue bulky waste collection fee tickets.**
 - *Check stores dealing with bulky waste collection fee tickets on Moriguchi City’s website.

There are **two types** of bulky waste collection fee tickets: **300-** and **600-** yen tickets.
*You cannot use waste collection tickets issued by other cities.

- Call the Telephone Appointment Center if you request the city to collect a dead animal, such as a cat and dog, or you wish to carry it in the municipal facilities.
- You can carry a dead animal in Moriguchi City Hall and the incineration facilities (Clean Center).
- When a collector pick the animal up, the collector issues a statement of payment. Pay the fee at a financial institution later.

【When a collector picks up】 **【When you carry in】**
○ 3,500 yen/companion animal ○ 3,000 yen/companion animal

Precautions!

- Hours for picking up/carrying in dead animals are 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (including national holidays).
- After the hours on weekdays and on Saturdays and Sundays, the staff in the gatehouse of the Moriguchi City Hall will keep the dead animal.
- If you carry a dead animal in the city hall, proceed to the gatehouse.
- When carrying in a dead animal, please bring a certificate proving that you are a citizen of Moriguchi City. (e.g., your driver’s license and health insurance card).

How to dispose of the waste

- Carry your waste in the following public facilities in the city where drop-off boxes are installed.
- Used small appliances only include waste small appliances that are generated from households and that can be thrown in the drop-off boxes through their slots (20 x 35 cm).
- Use this service during the opening hours of the public facilities.

[Installation locations of drop-off boxes]

- ◎ Moriguchi City Hall
- ◎ Incineration facilities (Clean Center) of Moriguchi City
- ◎ Community center in each region

Common examples



Digital cameras, video cameras, laptops and notebooks, cell phones/PHS cell phones, smartphones, portable music players, cassette tape recorders, home video and handheld game consoles, electronic dictionaries, pocket electronic calculators, DVD players, HDD recorders, digital clocks, car navigation systems, car audio systems, digital thermometers, hair dryers, remote controllers, AC adapters, etc.

*Used small appliances contain valuable metals, such as rare metals. To circulate and utilize valuable resources, we ask for your further cooperation in recycling waste.

Precautions!

- Be sure to delete your personal information from your cell phones/PHS cell phones, smartphones, and PCs.
- After putting your trash in a drop-off box, you cannot take it out of the box.
- Remove the dry batteries in your waste small appliances and put the batteries in a drop-off box for used dry batteries.
- Do not put built-in rechargeable batteries in drop-off boxes for used dry batteries.

How to dispose of the waste

- Carry your waste in the following public facilities in the city where drop-off boxes are installed.
- The drop-off boxes are located next to a drop-off box for used small appliances.

- ◎ Incineration facilities (Clean Center) of Moriguchi City
- ◎ Community center in each region

Common examples

Only disposable manganese and alkaline batteries are acceptable.

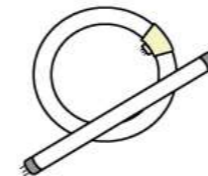
*Do not put in the drop-off boxes rechargeable batteries, button cells, and lithium-ion batteries because these batteries may ignite.

*Commercial waste batteries are not acceptable.

[Fluorescent lights]



Only lamps using mercury (straight, circular, and compact fluorescent lamps) are acceptable.

*Commercial waste fluorescent bulbs are not acceptable.

Lamps using mercury

- Fluorescent lamps
Widely used in main rooms in a house, such as living room, dining room, rest room, and bedroom
- High-intensity discharge lamps
Used for gardens or other places

Lamps not using mercury

- Incandescent light bulbs
Widely used in households
- Halogen lamps
Used for spotlighting or other lighting
- LED lamps
Lamps that conserve energy and are being widely used in households in recent year





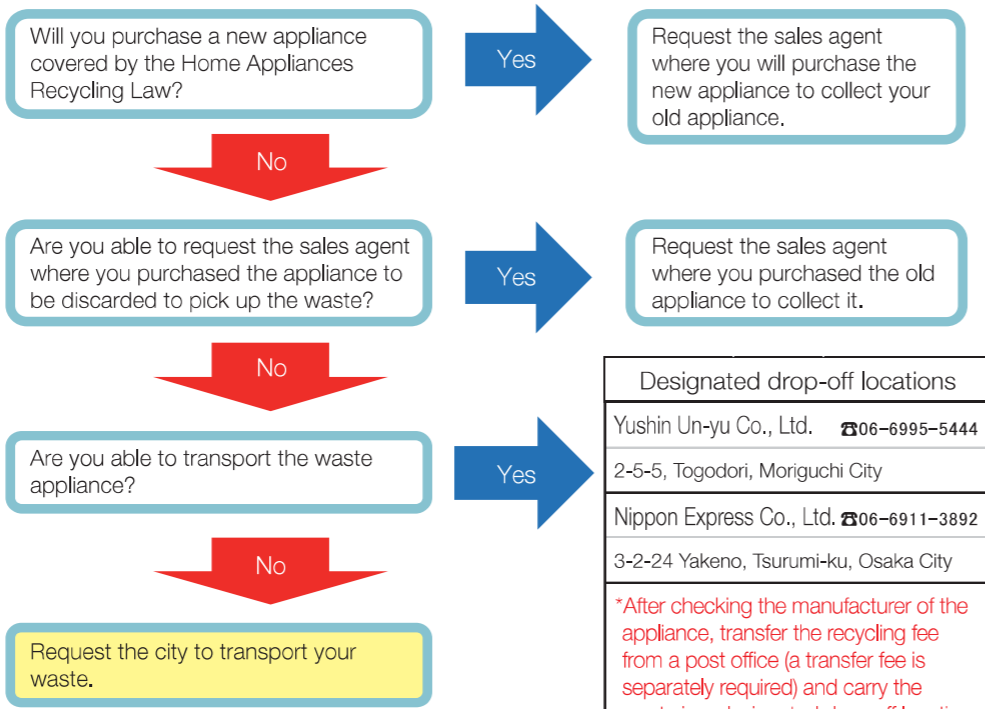

The Home Appliances Recycling Law obliges:

- Consumers to bear the recycling fee,
- Sales agents to collect used home appliances, and
- Appliance manufacturers to recycle used appliances.




How to dispose of the waste




- [When requesting the city to transport the waste]
- Schedule an appointment by calling the Telephone Appointment Center. **Telephone Appointment Center (06-6997-7766)**
 - Transfer the recycling fee from a post office in advance. **(A transfer fee is separately required.)**
 - On the appointment date, the waste collectors will pick up the waste appliance with the presence of the applicant. **(The waste will be collected in front of your house or at the garbage collection site in the case of an apartment house.)**
 - **Collection/transport fee: 3,500 yen/appliance**
When the waste collectors pick up the waste appliance, the collector issues a statement of payment. Pay the fee at a financial institution later.



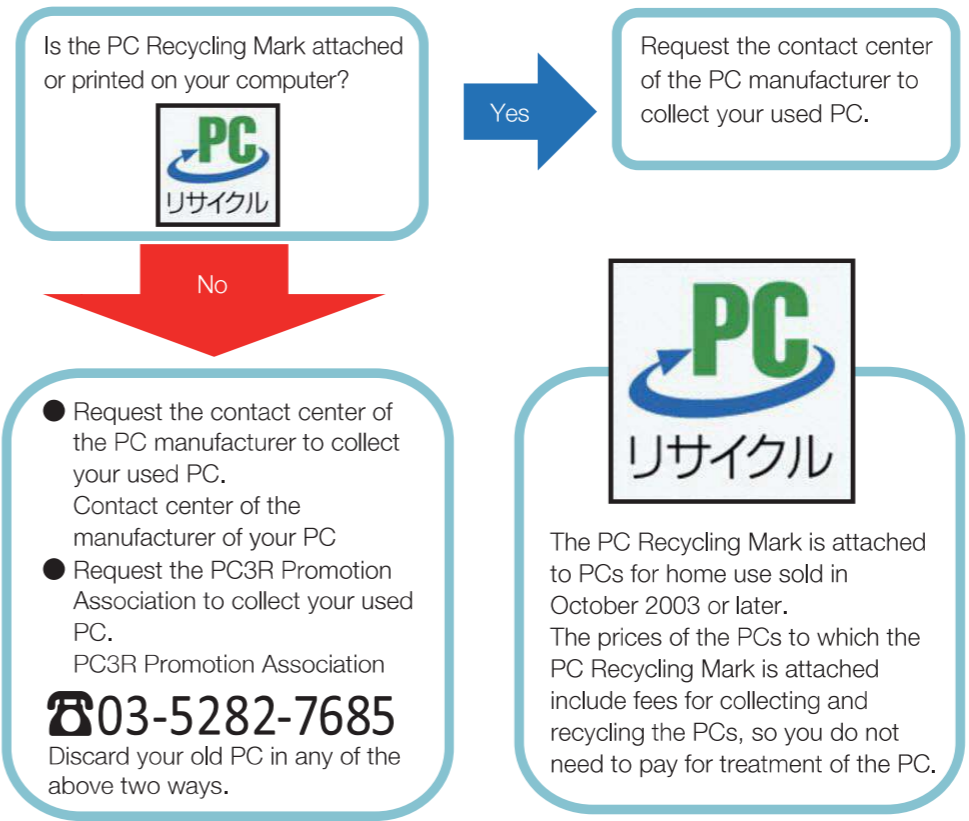

Since October 2003, the Act on the Promotion of Effective Utilization of Resources has obliged PC manufacturers and other related organizations to collect and recycle used PCs for home use.

How to dispose of the waste



- To discard PCs without the PC Recycling Mark, you need to transfer the PC recycling fee.
- Even when the PC Recycling Mark is attached, you will need to pay the collection and recycling fees if the PC manufacturer no longer exists due to bankruptcy or other reasons.
- Computers that can be put into a drop-off box for small appliances (lateral, 20 cm; longitudinal, 35 cm) can be collected as a used small appliance using the drop-off box service.
- PC manufactures will also collect standard accessories (e.g., mouse, keyboard, and cables).

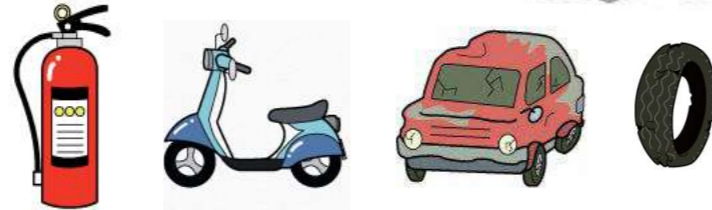

 - Items covered by the Act on Recycling of Specified Kinds of Home Appliances (Home Appliances Recycling Law)

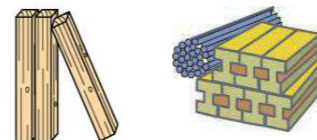

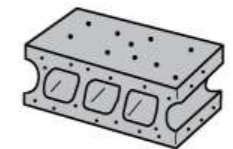

Collection of recyclables as a group in Moriguchi City

Moriguchi City grants 4 yen per waste of 1 kg (as of April 2020) as a subsidy to groups that collect used paper/cloth and empty cans as a group, such as residents' associations, town assemblies, children's groups, and seniors' associations, in each region in the city. We request groups that have not implemented collection of waste as a group yet to start establishing the system of collecting waste as a group to accelerate recycling.

【Applicable recyclables】

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Cardboard
- Milk cartons
- Used cloth
- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans



【Flow of registering a group implementing collection as a group for subsidy application】

1. Register your group as a group implementing collection of recyclables as a group.
2. Have resource recycling companies buy collected recyclables.
*Recyclable collectors do not always pay money to receive the waste items depending on fluctuations in the prices of recycled resources.
3. Put related data together and apply for the subsidy biannually on March and September every year.

Non-acceptable stickers

If waste that cannot be collected for reasons, such as an incorrect collection day for the waste and waste that is not correctly separated, is placed at the collection site, the city's waste collectors will attach a sticker for awareness building and leave the waste at the site. Correctly separate your waste and dispose of each waste on the specified collection days.
